### **Year 10 Exam Preparation & Holiday Revision – Combined Science GCSEs**

As your son/daughter gets ready to start the final journey towards the science GCSE exams in the Spring and Summer of 2019, you will be aware of how important structured revision is for the 'knowledge rich curriculum' they will be assessed on. We intend to give all students a starting point by providing them with a complete set of Exam Practice Workbooks to be used alongside the CGP revision guides we recommend for revision. These workbooks will be given to every Year 10 student free of charge before the summer holidays to provide them with exam question practice during the break and throughout the coming year.

As you will appreciate, this opportunity will only be of benefit if the workbooks are put to good use throughout the next ten months. Students will be expected to complete specific sections throughout the remainder of their time at Outwood Academy Bydales and their work will be marked periodically at specific deadlines. It is part of all students homework and as such your son/daughter will be expected to complete the required pages by the deadlines or they will receive a C4a detention. The deadlines will be tied in to support all future mock examinations and Praising Stars and will allow staff and students to identify areas of strength and development in advance for the final GCSE science exams.
