Inclusion Quality Mark

Outwood Academy Bydales is pleased to announce that we were recently awarded flagship school status by the IQM, one of only around 100 schools in the country to have achieved this award. The IQM "provides UK schools with a nationally recognised validation of their inclusive practice and ongoing commitment to developing educational inclusion", and as a flagship school we have committed to furthering our work on inclusion through internal research activities, building on the excellent inclusive practices that already exist in school.

Attendance

Our attendance remains high in comparison to the national average for secondary schools, but we can't take this for granted and continue to encourage you to send your child into school whenever possible; including not taking holidays during term time. The link between attendance and attainment is strong, on average students who attend over 95% of the time achieve 2 grades higher across every subject than those whose attendance is below 90%.

We've been looking at the comments made in the attendance survey that we asked you to complete this term and will be using the feedback from both students and parents to think about how we can improve how we monitor and reward good attendance moving forward.

Year II Revision Evening and Mocks

There has been a slight change in the date of the YII mock exams scheduled for next term. These will now take place between 19th February 2024 and 1st March 2024, the first two weeks back after February half term; although we may need to extend this a little once the timetable is completed. These mock exams are an important part of students' preparation for sitting their GCSEs in the summer and will replicate what that experience will be like.

To support students with their revision we will be hosting a revision carousel evening on Tuesday 30th January 2024. Further details of this and other support for our YTT students will follow in a separate communication in the new term, including details of our prom passport and other incentives to encourage regular revision.

Mental Health and Well-being

Within school our Mental Health and Wellbeing programme has been led and supported by our mental health leads Mr Clayton and Mrs Hudson, supported by our staff ambassadors - Miss Bullock, Mr Beacham, Mrs Willett, Mrs Hassack, Miss Dering, Miss Robinson, Miss Ritchie and Mrs Wears. This term we have been training our student mental health ambassadors through the HeadStarters programme. These students recently attended a local event at Middlesbrough Town Hall where they met up with HeadStarters from other schools to share their learning with each other and to celebrate their achievements. The HeadStarters Network will be given the platform and support to work together on a multi-school project to raise awareness of mental health and emotional wellbeing while also helping to shape the future of HeadStart.

Last week our talented cast and crew performed a stage version of Mary Poppins. The two shows were fantastic, thank you to those of you who came along to watch and a massive thank you to both the students and the staff who dedicated their time to put this show on. We definitely have some extremely talented performers at Bydales!









Public Health South Tees Message

Accompanying this letter is a message sent to all secondary schools in Redcar and Cleveland to be distributed to families right across the authority to highlight the concerns about the number of young people in schools in the area who are collapsing after vaping THC or SPICE in schools. As the legal age to buy vapes is 18 they remain completely banned from the school site and any student caught with a vape will face serious sanctions. The rise in the sale of illegal vapes is a serious concern. We ask that you read this letter and if necessary discuss this issue with your child.
